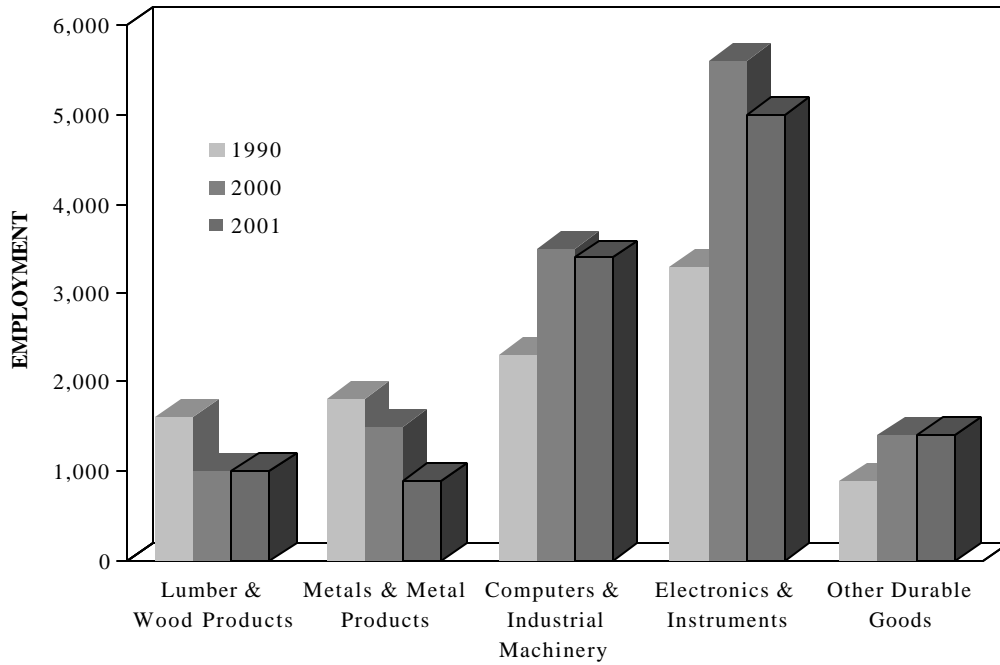

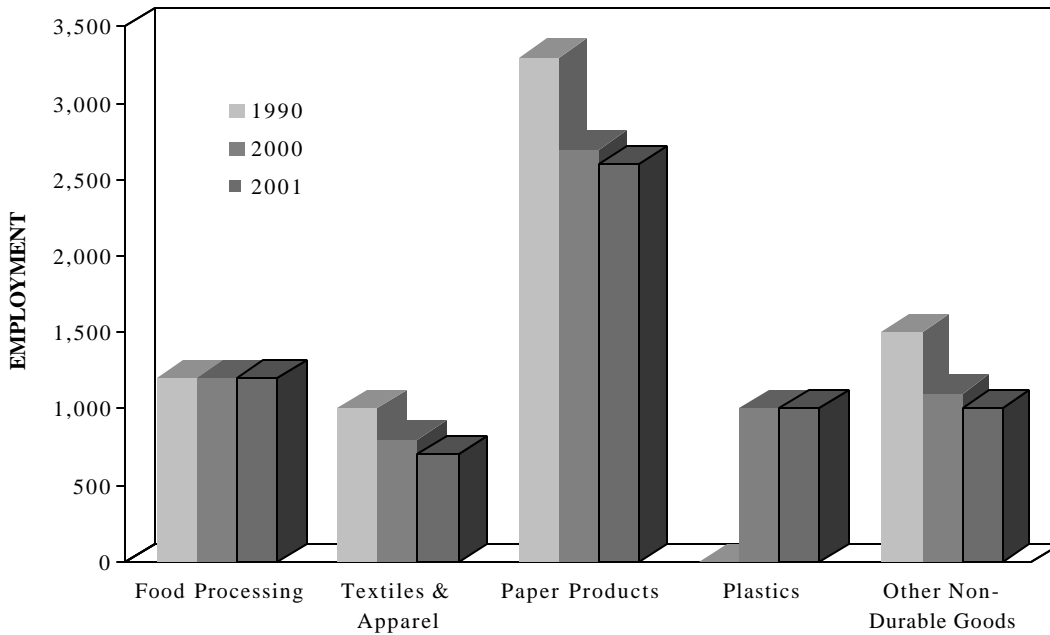


EMPLOYMENT BY MANUFACTURING FOR CLARK COUNTY: 1990, 2000, AND 2001

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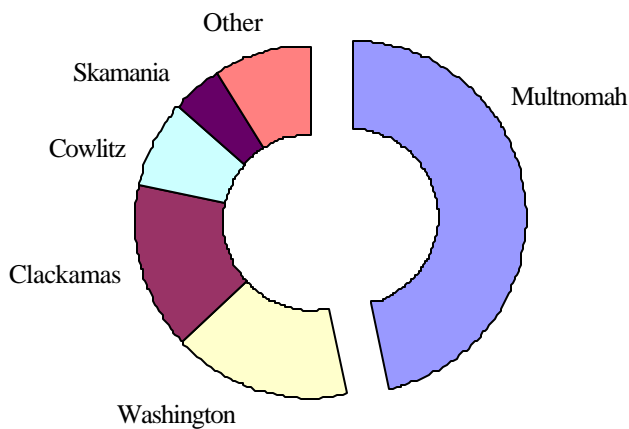

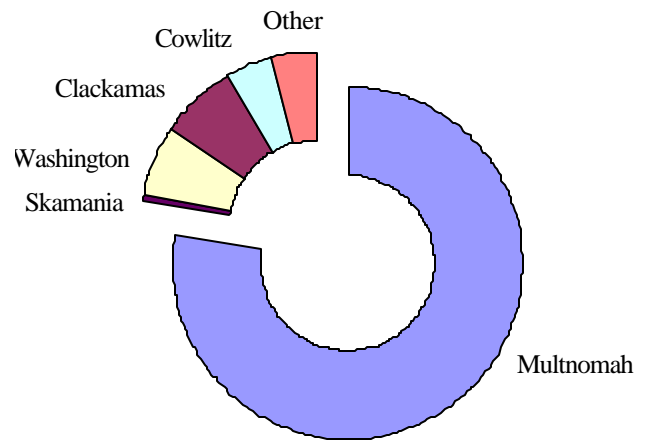

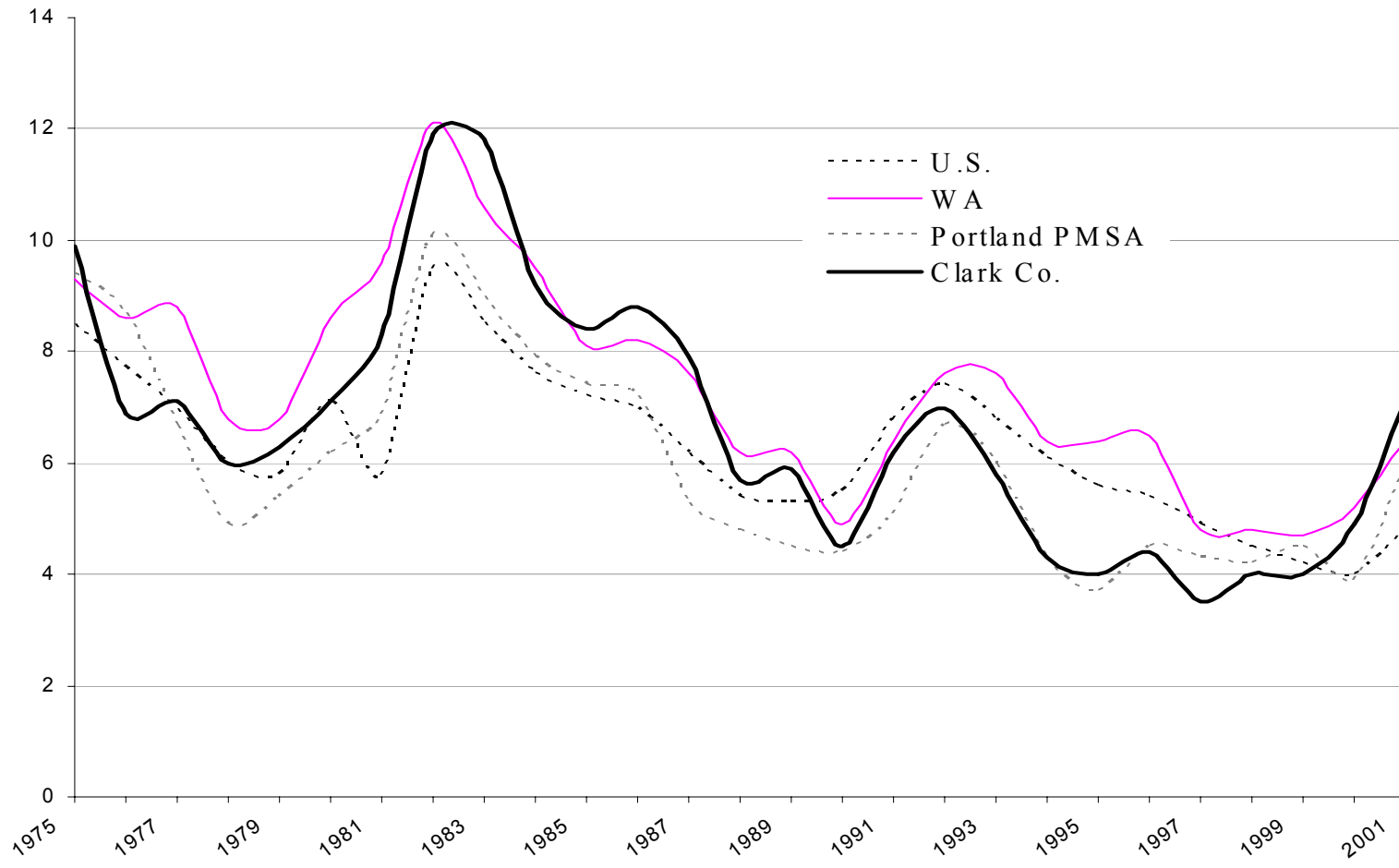
